4:00pm Come and hear **John Stainer's meditation on the sacred passion of the Holy Redeemer, *The Crucifixion***, sung by the combined choirs of St Mary Redcliffe and Bath Abbey.

6:30pm Music and readings for Passion Sunday, sung by the Redcliffe Chamber Choir.

Sunday 14 April - Palm Sunday

9:30am Sung Eucharist, which starts outside the church as we process with Christ into Jerusalem (without a donkey!) and then hear the whole of the Passion Narrative.

Thursday 18 April - Maundy Thursday

7:30pm Sung Eucharist, which follows the story of the last night of Jesus' earthly life. We wash feet, as he did; we break bread, as he did; and we keep watch, as he did. then we wait for the events of Good Friday to unfold.

Friday 19 April - Good Friday

12:00-3:00pm Johann Sebastian Bach's ***St John's Passion*** and **Good Friday Children's Workshop**. (see details below)

Saturday 20 April - Easter Eve

8:30pm From darkness to light A candlelit liturgy that starts with a new fire, visits the Easter garden, reminds us of our baptism and ends with the account of the resurrection.

Sunday 21 April - Easter Day

9:30am Festival Eucharist for the celebration of Easter Day

6:30pm Easter Songs of Praise Easter hymns, joyful choir music with bible readings and poems to celebrate the resurrection.

Bach's *St John's Passion*

The Rt Rev David Stancliffe, former Bishop of Salisbury, will bring worshippers and music-lovers together in experiencing the Passion according to St John through the theology and musical imagination of Johann Sebastian Bach.

Those present will have a full text of Bach's ***St John's Passion*** in German with a facing English translation. Each hour's section will have both an introduction to the theology and space for reflection.

Using period instruments and a lighter singing style, the church choir will be joined by The Bishop's Consort for this novel, and deeply rewarding, experience.
